EU Hydrogen Roadmap – a timeline

- **2020 2025**
 - 6 GW renewable hydrogen electrolysers
 - Production of 1 million tonnes of renewable hydrogen
 - Start decarbonisation of existing hydrogen production
 - Increase hydrogen refuelling stations
 - Establish infrastructure for carbon capture
- **2025 2030**
 - 40 GW renewable hydrogen electrolysers
 - Production of 10 million tonnes of renewable hydrogen
 - Increase new applications for industry and transport
 - Increase carbon capture
 - Develop local hydrogen clusters
 - Planning of pan-European grid
- **2030 2050**
 - 25% of renewable electricity used for hydrogen production

EU Hydrogen Roadmap (cont.)

- European Clean Hydrogen Alliance
 - Represents hydrogen value chain
 - Identifies pipeline for viable investment projects
- Coordination of national hydrogen development plans
- Funding and support
 - Enabling state aid for IPCEI (Important Projects of Common European Interest)
 - Doubling of InterestEU programme
- Boosting demand in industry and transport (e.c. emission standards)
- Policy framework for the promotion of hydrogen production (e.c. low carbon threshold, ETS, support schemes)
- Legal and regulatory framework for hydrogen infrastructure and market rules
- Promotion of research and innovation
- International cooperation and partnerships
